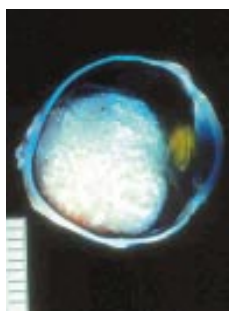


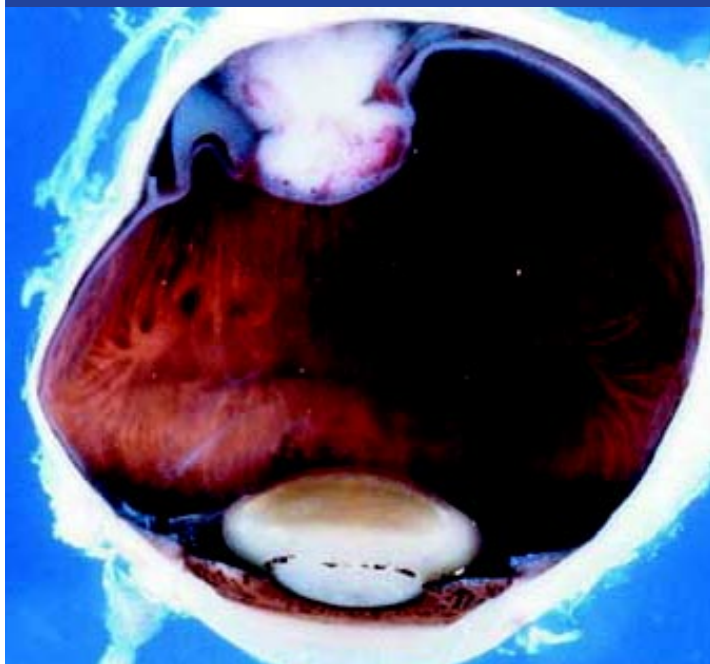

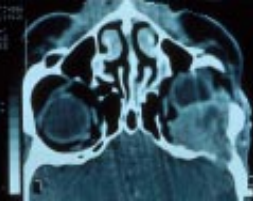

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is designed to enhance the basic education of ophthalmologists (residents, general practitioners, and specialists) with respect to the normal and pathologic structure of ocular tissues. This five-day course consists of a comprehensive survey of pathologic conditions affecting the eye and ocular adnexa. The lectures will be richly illustrated by x-rays, scans, photographs, photomicrographs, electron micrographs, etc., and supported by outlines and references.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to enhance the basic education of ophthalmologists (residents, general practitioners, and specialists) with respect to the normal and pathologic structure of ocular tissues. TUITION is \$890.

An administrative fee of \$100 per registrant will be deducted for cancellation. **Refund requests must be received in writing no later than one week prior to the course.** No refunds will be made thereafter.

Course fees are payable by check or money order to the **American Registry of Pathology** or by VISA, MasterCard, or American Express and are due at the time of enrollment. To register by mail, complete the form and send it with payment to the Department of Medical Education at the AFIP. To register by telephone, fax, or Internet, credit card payment is required.

The AFIP recommends you fax your application or register online to avoid mail delays.

Audiotaping or videotaping is prohibited.
